University of Pune Centre of Advanced Study in Sanskrit Syllabus for the One Year P.G. Certificate Course in Manuscriptology.

- 1. The duration of the Certificate Course in Manuscriptology shall be one academic year of two terms of fourteen weeks each.
- 2. The teaching for the Certificate Course shall be four hours per week.
- 3. A **graduate** in any subject shall be eligible for admission to the Certificate Course in Manuscriptology.
- 4. The Certificate Course Examination shall be held once a year at the end of the second term.
- 5. The examination for the Certificate course shall consist of 4 papers of hundred marks. The paper I, II & III shall be of three hours duration, carrying hundred marks each. Paper IV shall consist of two parts: 1) Textual Criticism of 50 marks and 2) Practical of 50 marks.
- 6. To pass the Certificate Course examination a candidate must obtain 40% of the total marks in each head of passing and 50% of the total marks in aggregate and shall be placed in Second Class. Those of the successful candidates who obtain 60% of the total marks shall be placed in First Class.
- 7. Classes for the Course shall be held at the Centre of Advanced study in Sanskrit. University of Pune, Ganeshkhind, Pune 411 007.
- 8. Fees for the Certificate Course shall be as per University Rules
