'Reflection of India-Israel bond can be seen in education sector'

PUNE: According to the Israel ambassador to India, Daniel Carmon, more than 10 per cent of foreign students in Israeli universities are Indians, and many among those are from Pune, reflecting the strong bilateral ties between the two nations.
