



SCOPE of Disaster Management and National Security Course

The course will enable students to learn different areas of disaster management, which include-management of the situation, response to the needs of the people, evacuation process, distribution of food and issues related to Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear (CBRN) Disasters.

Rationale of the PG Diploma:
