About myself:

As an economist, I have been working in the field for over twenty years involving research and post-graduate teaching. As a development economist, my research interests have diversified from transition economics and area studies (Soviet Russia) into more grass-root experiences of development in India – including gender studies, role of education, material culture and globalization. In the area of unorganized sector labour markets in India, I have been engaged in extensive ethnographic studies to explore the economic and cultural dimensions of prostitution in India. I have co-edited a book on sex-work in India, one of the first pan-India efforts on understanding the heterogeneity of the profession in the Indian context.

I have published extensively in the areas of higher education as a building block of human capital and the problems of a developing country in the higher education delivery systems. The other areas that have been of great interest to me are - the process of urbanization and migration patterns, the cultures of consumption and the economic drivers of mass/popular cultures.
