1. Lecture Discussion on "West Asia Today" on 20 February 2013 by Amb. Rajendra Abhyankar .

The uprising in West Asia was holistically analyzed by the speaker in which he has broadly categorized the present situation and examined India's future role in the region.

He identified two key patterns in a nuclear rivalry – one, the pre-nuclear history which includes both ideational basis and material basis; secondly, the effects of nuclearization.



2. Yashwantrao Chavan Memorial Lecture, By Shri. R.D. Pradhan, IAS (Retd.) on Yashwantrao Chavan's Contribution to Indian's Defence and Security Policy on 4 September 2013

Yashwantrao Balwantrao Chavan, the Chief Minister of Maharashtra State was catapulted to the defence ministership of India on 21 November 1962. The Chinese attack on India's northern frontier and the reverses that India's troops suffered in the NEFA came as a shock to the nation. Chavan's emergence on the centre stage of the Indian political scene at this time attracted wide international attention as well. Shri. R.D.Pradhan worked as the Chief Minister's Private Secretary in Bombay and accompanied Chavan to Delhi. That gave him a vantage point from which to observe and participate in the many momentous events and matters that took place during that period in "DEBACLE To RESURGENCE".
