ANNOUNCEMENTS

(I) We regret to inform that an error has crept into the article "What is Philosophy of History"? by David Kipp published in I.P.Q. Vol. VI, No. 2, January 1979 on page 277, Para II. The correct version is as under :

"Assuming, then, that philosophy of history, in its proper, uniquely characteristic philosophical sense, is a fusion of metaphysical philosophy of historicity and interpretative philosophy of historicity, or what could be viewed as a.....",

(II) The Indian Philosophical Quarterly will have a special issue on "Comparative Philosophy : A Study in Philosophical Methodology". It will contain some articles written on special invitation from the editors, but they will also welcome articles from all those who are interested in the subject. An article meant for the volume should be a conceptual and methodological examination of the claims of the comparative method as a philosophical method and not a comparative discussion of some philosophical problem or problems, nor should it be predominantly a survey or historical account of some received theories on the subject. The articles for this volume should reach the editors by December 31, 1979. Interested authors should contact the editors for details of the plan.

(III) Volume I and II of the Indian Review of Philosophy, an organ of the Indian Philosophical Congress (now suspended) are available. Anyone interested in buying the volumes can get them from its editor (Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Professor of Philosophy, I. I. T., Kanpur 208 016) on payment of Rs. 15/- plus Rs. 5/- for postage per volume. The amount may be sent by a bank draft on State Bank of India, I. I. T. Kanpur, or by money order.

(IV) **Paramarsha :**

An independent philosophical quarterly in Marathi, published by Poona University and Pratap Centre of Philosophy, Amalner. It incorporates the famous *Tattva-jnan Mandir*, a Philosophical Quarterly, published by the Indian Institute of Philosophy, Amalner, now taken over by Poona University. Articles on any philosophical topic, written in Marathi are invited for being considered for publication. Articles should be submitted in duplicate, neatly hand-written or typed. Books in any language may be submitted for review.

(V) The Indian Philosophical Quarterly will devote one of its coming issues to 'Recent Indian Philosophy : Statements and Appraisals' intended to be a study of the creative writings of modern Indian Philosophers, published in India or abroad, in English or in any Indian language, after 1965. The editors invite articles discussing, characterising, or examining the views expressed in one or more than of one of these writings, as well as such ones which try to depict the directions Indian Philosophy may or should take in the coming future. One of the major objectives of the *Indian Philosophical Quarterly* is to promote philosophical discussions on the writings of present-day Indian Philosophers. One way to achieve this goal is to have some of the articles published in the *Indian Philosophical Quarterly* discussed and commented upon. The editors therefore invite articles written as discussion-notes on the articles published in any issue of the *Indian Philosophical Quarterly*. They also invite rejoinders from the authors on whose articles discussion-notes are published in the *Indian Philosophical Quarterly*.
